Familiarize yourself with the locations of your country's embassy or consulate in case of a lost passport or other legal emergencies. In Bangkok, embassies are typically located in the Sukhumvit area.

How do I book a train ticket?

Tickets can be booked online through www.yesmytrips.com or at railway station counters. It's advisable to book in advance for popular routes, especially during holidays.

What should I do if I miss my train?

If you miss your train, go to the ticket counter at the station as soon as possible. They may allow you to apply your ticket to a later train, usually subject to availability and a fee.

Can I bring food and beverages on board?

Yes, passengers are allowed to bring food and drinks onto the train. However, it's recommended to avoid strong-smelling items to respect fellow travelers.

Are there luggage restrictions?

Passengers have a baggage allowance depending of classes:

- 1st class: 60 kg (110 lbs)

- 2nd class: 40 kg (88 lbs)

- 3rd class: 30 kg (66 lbs)

Is it safe to travel by train in Thailand?

Train travel in Thailand is generally considered safe. However, travelers should be aware of their belongings and remain vigilant in crowded areas.

Are there any child discounts available with SRT?

Children under age of 3 and not taller than 100cm (39.37 inch) travel for free, children between the age of 3 to 11 and not taller than 150cm (59 inch) have discount price.

When does booking open?

Most of the trains are open up to 6 months ahead, some mid and short distance route are open up 1 to 30 day ahead.
